

# Internet safety

We have been asked to share a public awareness information sheet by the Dorset Safeguarding Team. It has been attached and contains information about an emerging online threat. It is important to note that the online platforms being targeted include Minecraft and Roblox. The flyer includes upsetting yet important information for parents with the important message being 'to foster the open dialogue with your children around online gaming'.

# A snapshot of learning for this week:

In Explorers we have focussed on looking after ourselves including road safety, self-care and daily routines.









In Adventurers we have been exploring the weather, we have enjoyed looking at weather forecasts and how accurate they are. We have also become weather reporters, recording what the weather has been like each day to then create and telling our own forecasts using a map of the United Kingdom. In maths this week we have been learning about 3D shapes and their properties and have been printing with them to explore the shapes of the faces. We have also explored the different 3D shapes in our classroom, we found lots in our junk modelling area and used them to make some super creations!







In Voyagers we have been looking at Samuel Pepys and the important role he played in the Great Fire of London. Not only that he was the link between King Charles II and the Lord Mayor of London, but that he documented the whole event in detail so that 359 years later we know the ins and outs of the Great fire and can learn from it.

In Navigators we have begun reading our next Favourite 5 text 'The boy who swam with piranhas' identifying paragraphs and exploring alliteration. We have also written some beautifully presented writing showcasing our understanding of paragraphs. We have been using magnets to test whether different materials are magnetic and found that some metals are magnetic, whilst others are non-magnetic.

### A snapshot of learning for next week:

In Explorers we will be looking at how we grow and change and what gives us our identity.

In Adventurers we will be investigating, do we ever run out of rain? We will be exploring parts of the world that experience lots and little rain and thinking about what happens when there is no rain

In Voyagers we will be identifying and testing different everyday materials to find out why we choose them for different jobs. We will be explaining their properties in order to justify why they are used to make certain objects.

In Navigators we have a very busy week next week with two school trips! On Tuesday we will be visiting the Larmer Tree gardens to explore them through art, dance and drama, and on Wednesday we are visiting the Lighthouse theatre to watch and perform alongside the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra. We will also continue with our science learning about magnets and will begin to think of ideas for our 'Entrepreneur project' after half term.
