Dear parents and carers,

Today we bid a fond farewell to the chicks in reception – we have learnt so much but it is time for them to move on to new homes.



Years 3 and 4 have been trialling a new wellbeing app (we are the 2<sup>nd</sup> school in Dorset to have this). The best way to describe it is to imagine the electronic 'check ins' in a surgery with each child having their own portal. They can then record how they feel coming into school and after lunch and attribute their feelings (positive and negative) to events in school, at home or online. This allows the older children a little more anonymity and means we can respond quickly and appropriately to any concerns.

Thanks to your fundraising, we have a number of good quality garden benches and tables on the field. Please could I ask for some volunteers to help move them onto the playground – they are quite heavy!

**Navigators and Pioneers have been** proof reading, editing and improving our writing about the Great Kapok Tree. We have also been writing poetry about the rainforest. We have been drawing self-portraits, focusing on detail and using balances and jumps to create a gymnastic routine.









#### A snapshot of learning for next week:

In Explorers we will be basing our learning around the theme of hedgehogs.

**In Adventurers we will** continue our Autumnal theme and move on to finding out what a Harvest Festival is. We will be doing a little bit of research before taking part in our school Harvest Festival to help join all our learning together.

In Voyagers we will be classifying British trees and venturing for an Irish twist.

**In Navigators and Pioneers we will be** investigating how living things adapt to their habitat, looking at different non-fiction texts and retrieving and recording important information, and presenting our learning about the rainforest using presentation software.
