Barriers to achievement
<p>Barriers to achievement in our school typically are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Inability to access home learning • Less time to practice skills at home i.e regular reading, playing number games • Reduced access to resources at home in particular high quality reading texts that support work in school • Less opportunity for enrichment visits • Less able to afford school uniform/shoes/sports kit • Less access to play productively alongside peers • Less access to transport to enrich the curriculum • Reduced access to 1-1 time with an adult • Low self esteem and vulnerability to mental health problems • Rural location reduces opportunities such as listed above
